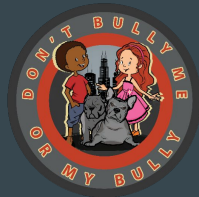

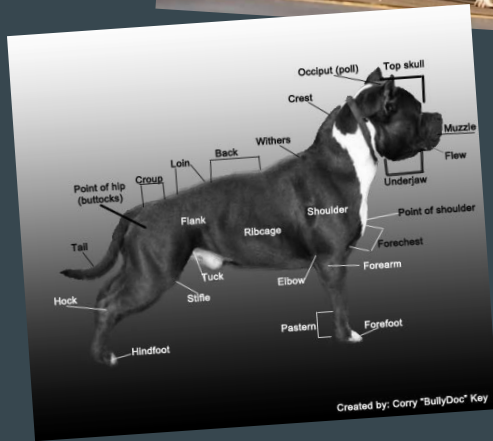

- Learn about dogs and dog shows.

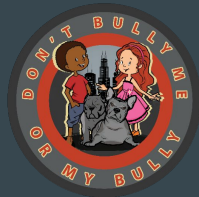


WHAT TO EXPECT FOR 4 WEEKS
